

LA Pride committee seeks community honorees

LOS ANGELES, CA -- <u>Christopher Street West</u> (CSW), the nonprofit organization that produces the annual Los Angeles PRIDE celebration in West Hollywood, is seeking nominations for 2012 Community Honorees.

CSW is looking for people in the LGBT community who are deserving of this recognition. All nominations must be submitted by 5:00pm on Friday, February 3, 2012.

According to a statement issued by CSW, "Each year, honorees who reflect our diverse community are selected for their demonstrated commitment to equality, human rights, empowerment and overall contributions to the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community."
